President's Message

On behalf of SGEU, Happy New Year!

The start of a new year is always a good time to reflect on the challenges faced in the previous year, and to celebrate our successes. It's also a great time to look at the opportunities that lie ahead.

This past year, we saw our provincial government make decisions that weren't in the best interest of working people. 2017 kicked off with Premier Scott Moe promising to cut the public service by 5 per cent, and we responded.

By spring, Moe had given himself and Saskatchewan MLAs a 3.5 per cent wage increase, which saw their annual salaries rise from \$92,816 to \$96,183. Moe also approved an additional \$3,000 annual bonus for 13 legislative secretaries. These salary increases came at a time when many Saskatchewan families were struggling under rising costs, and when government was offering



zeros to our members at the bargaining table.

Bargaining update

While many of our bargaining units continue to press for fair and reasonable contracts, we have not seen as much progress as we would like at most of our bargaining tables. While government originally took a hard line and demanded major concessions, it has since backed off from most.

The PS/GE bargaining unit, which has received a strike mandate from its members, continues to negotiate an Essential Services Agreement, which must be in place before job action can be taken. If you are a PS/GE member and have questions, please contact your local representative.

SGEU's Health Providers bargaining unit, acting as part of an association with SEIU-West and CUPE, has been in negotiations for a new contract since May 2017.

Several other bargaining units have ratified collective agreements. These include the Saskatchewan Liquor and Gaming Authority (SLGA), H.E.L.P. Homes of Regina, Society for the Involvement of Good Neighbours (SIGN), RM of Meadow Lake, Cowessess First Nation and Moose Jaw Women's Transition Association.
